

Basic Barn Guidelines

In order to maintain safety and enjoyment of all approved persons and horses, we have established the following guidelines, and your cooperation, and that of your guests, is appreciated:

NO PERSON MAY RIDE OR HANDLE A HORSE WITHOUT THE APPLICABLE INSURANCE AND A SIGNED WAIVER.

- DO NOT FEED another boarders horse
- DO NOT RIDE, HANDLE, OR MEDICATE, another any other horse without permission of that horses owner
- PLEASE ENSURE GATES AND DOORS are kept closed
- The barn is open from **8am to 9pm**, visitation past 9pm must be approved by barn manager
- No horse is to be left unattended except while getting grooming tools or tack
- All riding and horse handling is done at your own risk, control of your horse must be maintained at all times
- Halters are to be taken off horses in pastures, or stalls, unless under special circumstances, after a discussion with the manager, and at the owners own risk
- All owners and riders need to pick up after their horses, themselves, and their approved guests, especially messes made by horses in communal areas
- Arena time is to be shared, but an hour per horse seems reasonable, if liberty work is being performed. Please check with other horse owners if space can be shared
- Board is due on the agreed date, late fees can be applied at the discretion of the barn manager
- Dogs are allowed, but the owner must maintain control of their pet, and limit excessive barking
- Please do not borrow or move others equipment without permission
- Damage to trailers or property is not the responsibility of the barn manager, or property owner
- Smoking is prohibited inside the barns, and arena, smoking is permitted by the burn barrel and butts must be disposed of in said barrel
- No alcohol, or being under the influence of substances, is permitted on the property
- Children under the age of 13 are to be supervised at all times and are not to climb on anything, and horse owners are **responsible** for their guests actions, and comments

These guidelines have been implemented for our barn community so the people and horses that are using this facility, are safe and happy, and respect, and common courtesy should be practised. If you have any comments, or questions, feel free to open a dialogue. If you chose to ignore the above, a discussion with the barn manager will occur. These are subject to change, please keep yourself up to date by regularly checking this sheet.
